Dear Congressman:

**I urge you to oppose any efforts to dismantle or weaken Wall Street reforms and consumer protections.** Congress should be doing much more, certainly not less, to make the financial system work for all Americans.

The **Consumer Financial Protection Bureau** was created to bring basic standards of fairness and transparency to a marketplace riddled with deception and trickery. Since opening in July 2011, the Bureau has helped all American consumers, including:

- Provided relief to 27 million Americans defrauded by banks or financial companies.
- Took action against debt collectors that victimized U.S. military servicemembers
- Battled financial abuse of senior citizens
- Obtained relief for students defrauded by predatory for-profit colleges
- Refunded Wells Fargo customers who had been charged for fake accounts.
- Proposed rules to rein in abuses of payday lenders and their 400% interest rate debt traps
- Restored the ability of consumers to challenge banks and lenders when they break the law.

America cannot afford to let financial ripoffs flourish. The overwhelming majority of us --regardless of where we live or how we identify politically -- support more, not less accountability and oversight for the financial system. I ask you to stand up for the consumer, and not put Wall Street and predatory lenders in charge of writing their own rules. We need the financial system to work for us, not against us.

I urge you to oppose any measure to change the structure of or weakening of the CFPB. Thank you.
